SNAP, the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (formerly, the Food Stamp Program), is a federally-funded program that helps millions of eligible, low-income households and individuals purchase nutritious and healthy food at participating grocery stores and farmers markets.



For every dollar invested, SNAP contributes \$1.73 back to the economy ¹.



In 2017, SNAP spending in Pennsylvania helped lift 340,000 people out of poverty².



Research has shown that receipt of SNAP in early childhood improves high school graduation rates, adult earnings, and adult health³.
