



## SNAP OUTREACH PROGRAM



The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP, formerly the Food Stamps Program) is a nutrition program that can help eligible seniors purchase food of their choosing from participating grocery stores and farmers markets. It is the cornerstone of the Nation’s nutrition assistance safety net.

### APPLYING FOR SNAP IS QUICK AND EASY FOR SENIORS WITHOUT EARNED INCOME

- Requires few or no verifications.
- Up to 3-year certification period.
- Shelter and medical expenses are deductible.

Income falling below a certain threshold does not automatically ensure eligibility. Eligibility is determined based on both income and allowable deductions. Guidelines are effective through September 30, 2025.

To file a program discrimination complaint, a Complainant should complete a Form AD-3027, USDA Program Discrimination Complaint Form which can be obtained online at: <https://www.usda.gov/sites/default/files/documents/ad-3027.pdf>, from any USDA office, by calling (866) 632-9992, or by writing a letter addressed to USDA. The letter must contain the complainant's name, address, telephone number, and a written description of the alleged discriminatory action in sufficient detail to inform the Assistant Secretary for Civil Rights (ASCR) about the nature and date of an alleged civil rights violation.
