



SNAP OUTREACH PROGRAM



The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP, formerly the Food Stamps Program) is a nutrition program that can help eligible seniors purchase food of their choosing from participating grocery stores and farmers markets. It is the cornerstone of the Nation's nutrition assistance safety net.

APPLYING FOR SNAP IS QUICK AND EASY FOR SENIORS WITHOUT EARNED INCOME

- Requires few or no verifications.
- Up to 3-year certification period.
- Shelter and medical expenses are deductible.

The letter must contain the complainant's name, address, telephone number, and a written description of the alleged discriminatory action in sufficient detail to inform the Assistant Secretary for Civil Rights (ASCR) about the nature and date of an alleged civil rights violation.
